

Disable Image Compression in MS PowerPoint

By default, images in a slideshow are compressed upon saving, resulting in loss of quality. This is ok as it saves time specially when you want to run the slideshow on a website. But if you are preparing a presentation where quality of image matter, this feature becomes a problem.

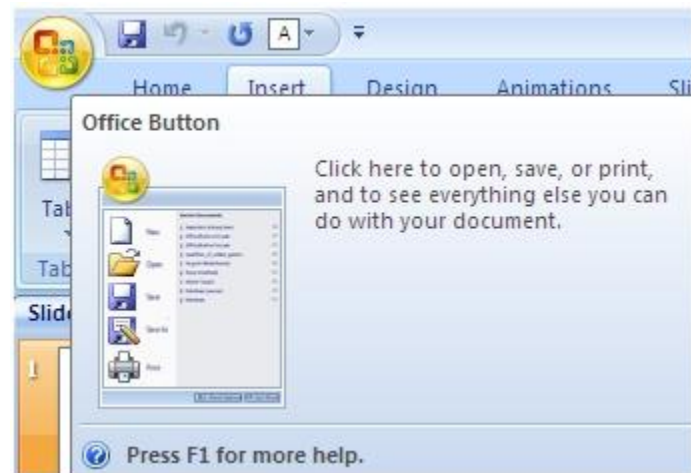

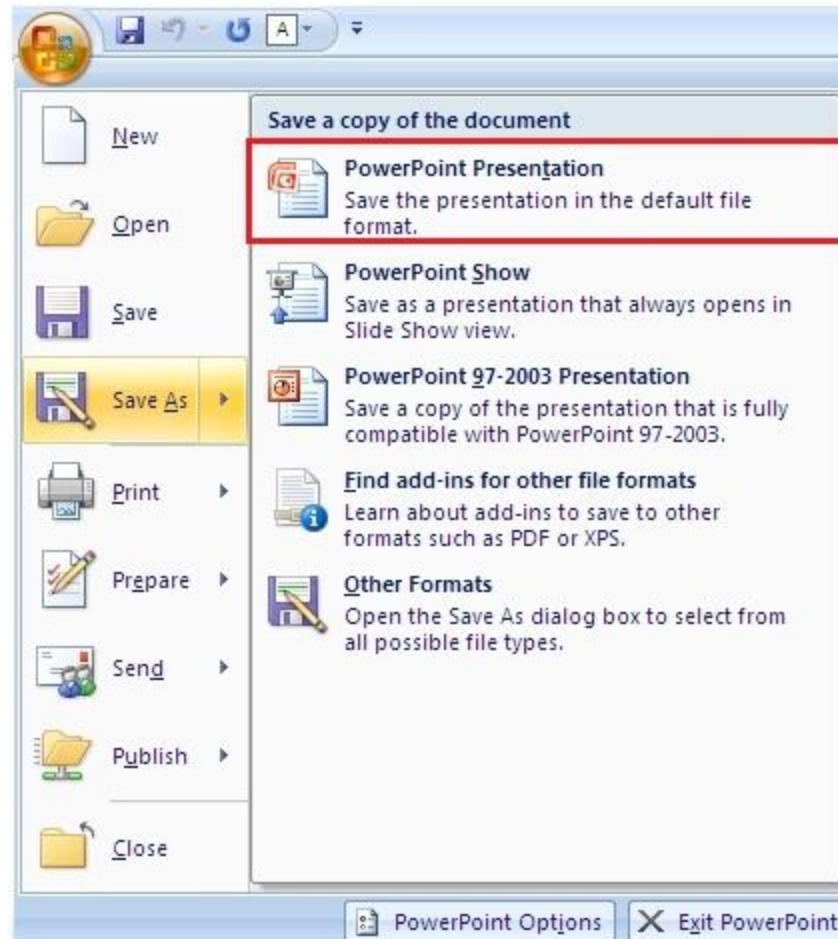

Disable Image Compression in MS PowerPoint

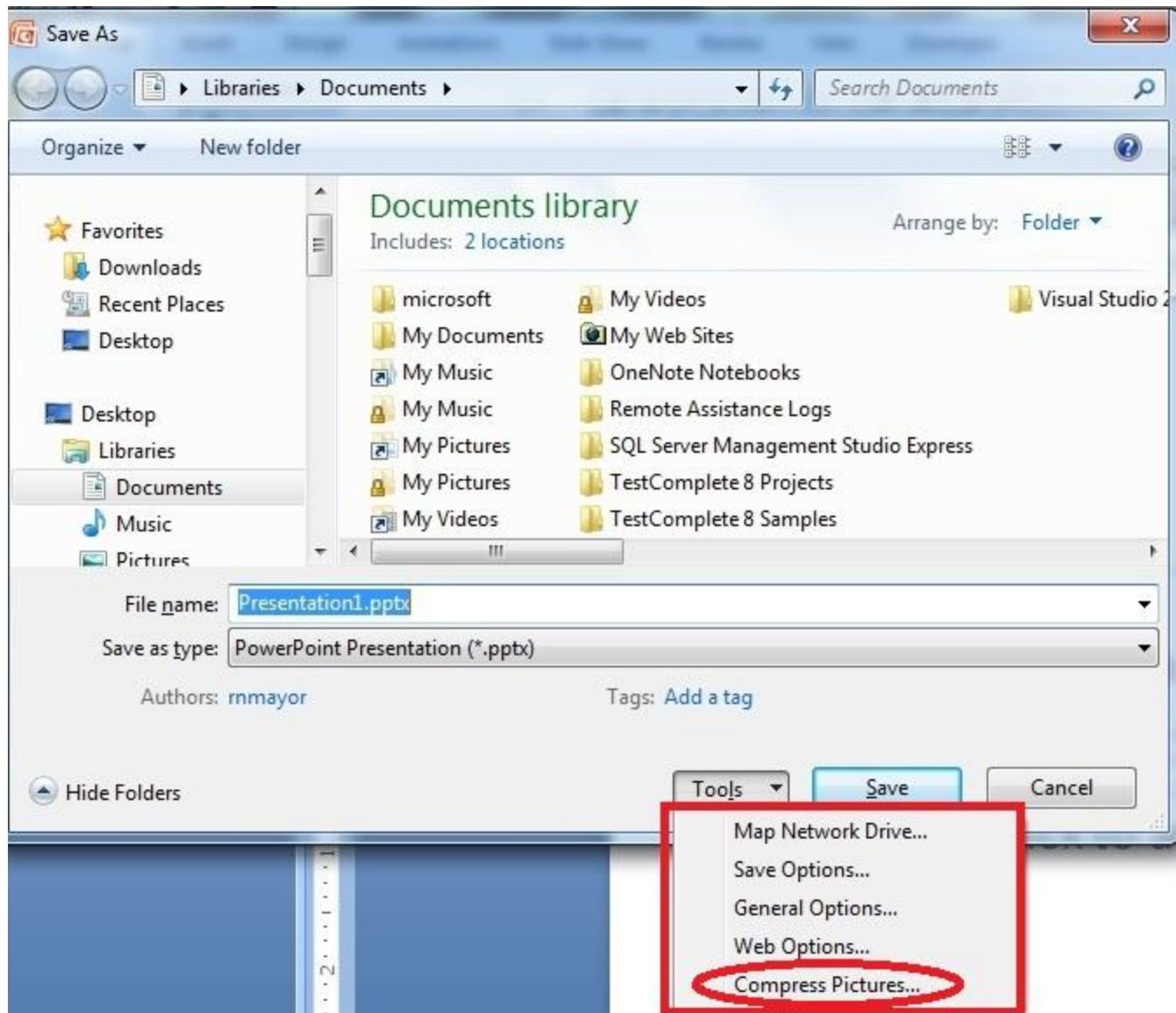
1. Click the *Office button*.



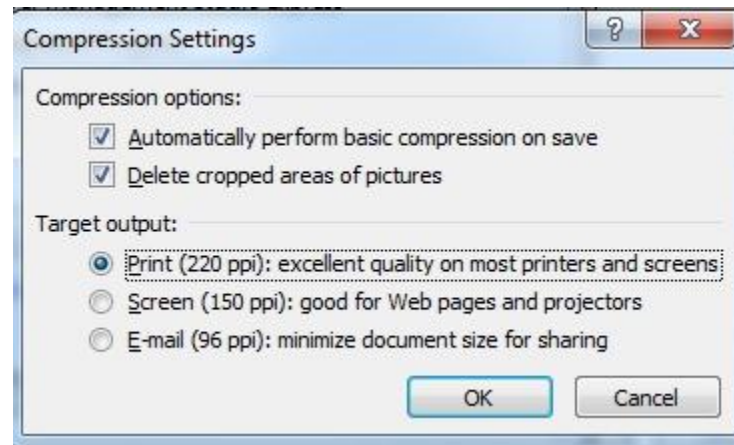
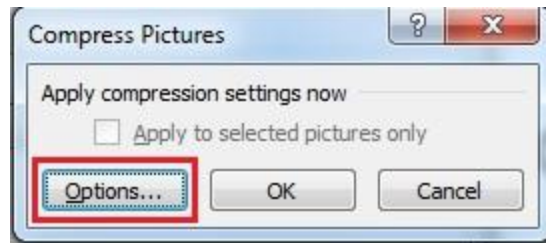
2. Click the *Save As > PowerPoint Presentation*.



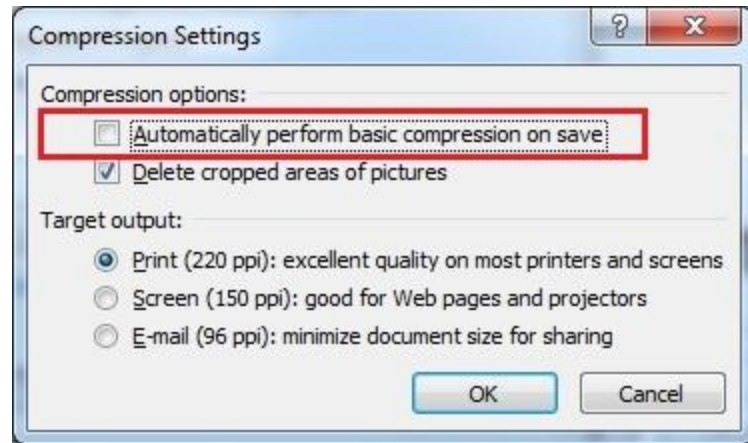
3. In the *Save As* dialog box, click *Tools>Compress Pictures*.



4. *Compress Pictures* dialog box will appear. Click *Options* button to open *Compression Settings* dialog box.



5. Under *Compression options:* menu, uncheck “*Automatically perform basic compression on save*”. Click OK and save your presentation.



***Note:** To revert the compression settings to its original settings, do steps 1-4 and under *Compression options*, check *“Automatically perform basic compression on save”*. For new presentations, MS PowerPoint automatically compress images by default so you need to set it again and do steps stated above.
