Resizing Photo Attachments

Did you know that sending many or large size photo attachments can result to huge e-mail sizes which may not be sent/received by the sender's/receiver's e-mail server.

Avoid this problem by resizing your photo attachments without using any image editing program.

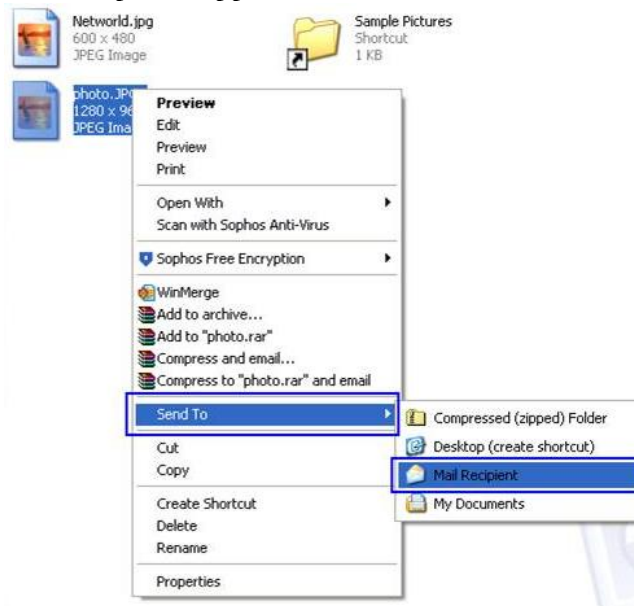

Resizing Photo Attachments

Letting Outlook reduce the file size of photos can save a lot of time instead of opening an image editing program. Resizing in Outlook will only take a few minutes and can be done in two ways

Using Send to Mail Recipient in Windows Explorer

In *Windows Explorer*, right-click on one or more images that you want to send. When the options appear, choose **Send To**, then **Mail Recipient**.



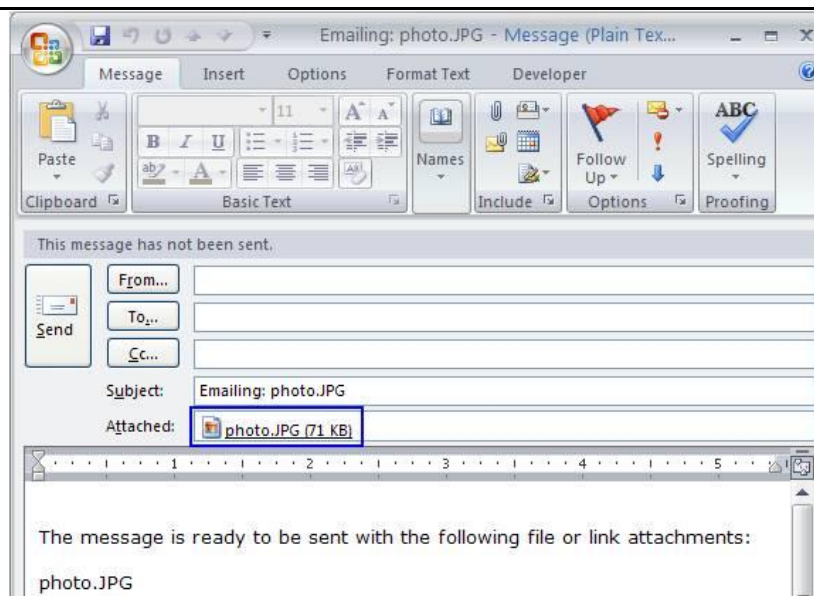
This will load the *Send Pictures via E-Mail* window. Choose the **Make all my pictures smaller**.



Click the *Show more options...* link to select among the available sizes.



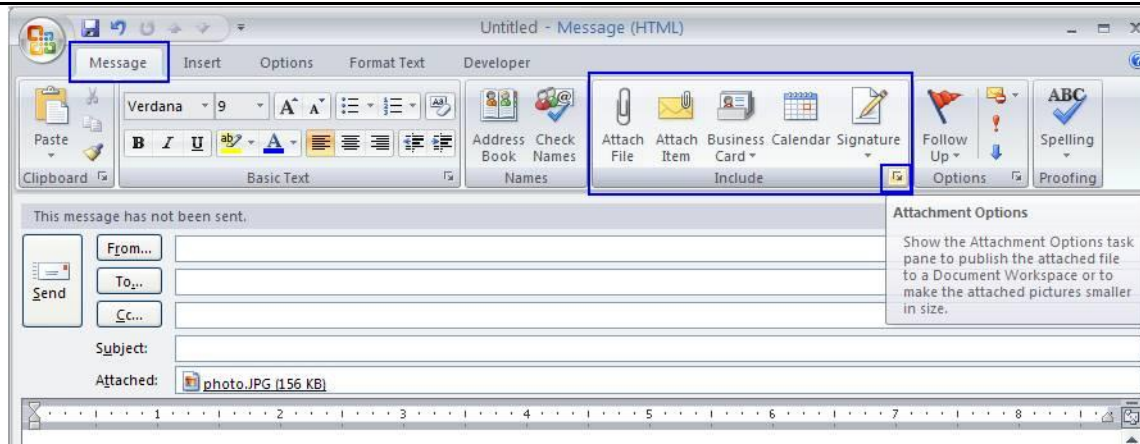
When the *OK* button is clicked, the resized image will be automatically attached in an e-mail draft.



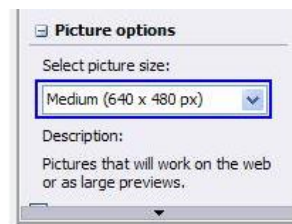
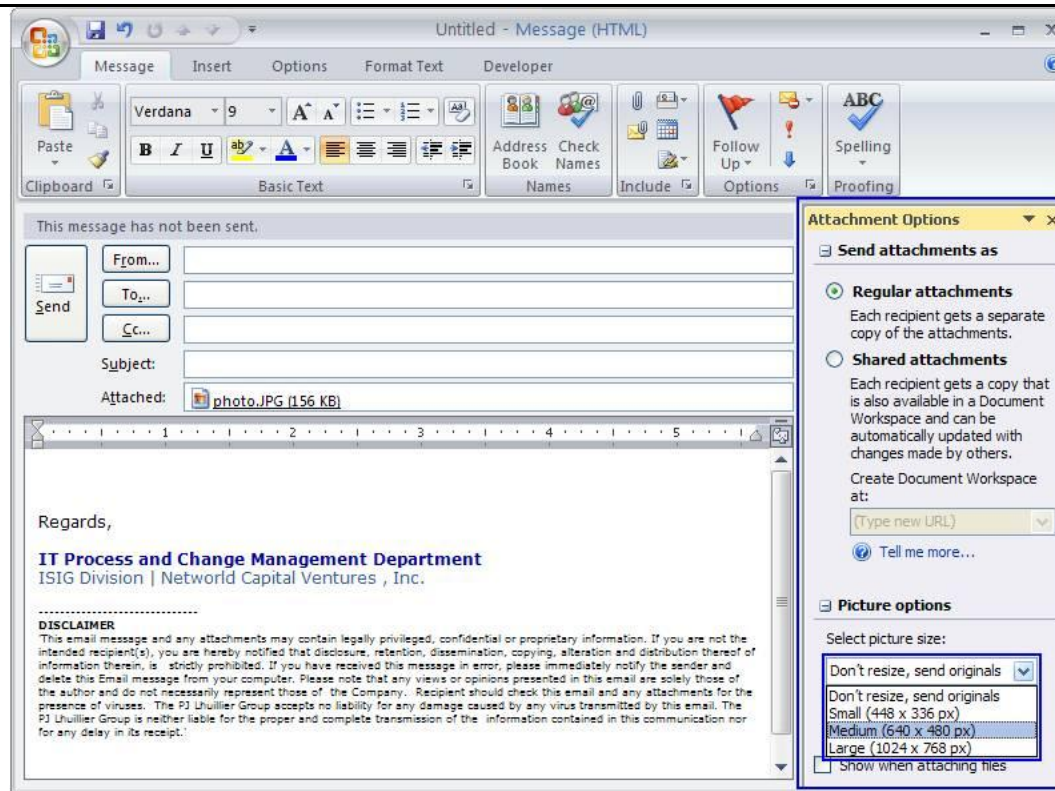
Using the Attachment Options in Outlook

When you have already composed your mail and attached the image, you can resize the photo by using the *Attachment Options* in Outlook.


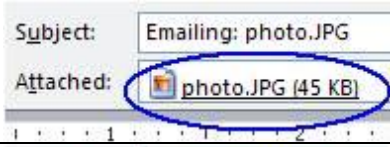

To enable the *Attachment Options* pane, expand the *Include* section of the *Message* ribbon.



When the *Attachment Options* pane is already enabled, select the image size that you want from the dropdown in the *Picture options*.
